OUR LOCAL HEALTH SERVICES

Tracey is calling on the local health board to do more to support people living with mental ill-health and addiction.

In addition, NHS Ayrshire and Arran should do more to ensure local residents have access to vital GP and dentistry services in their community.

Tracey said, "Now, more than ever, it is important that people have

timely access to comprehensive mental health and addiction support services.

"It is welcome that the latest figures show waiting times for child and adolescent mental health services (CAMHS) have improved but they still fall short of the Scottish Government's targets. I will fight to improve waiting times and get proper support to those who need it."



LOCAL CRIME PREVENTION

Local campaigner Tracey is committed to working closely with local police officers to support them in their efforts to prevent crime and anti-social behaviour throughout the Doon Valley ward.

The SNP Scottish Government have continually cut, withdrawn or centralised vital public services over their increasingly damaging tenure in Holyrood, and communities across the Doon Valley are seeing first hand the devastating impact these cuts are having.

Tracey said, “Local police officers do brilliant work under increasingly difficult conditions and their efforts should be commended. However, cuts to front line officers at the hands of



the Scottish Government make local policing harder than ever.

“I will work closely with the

local Police service and other agencies to reduce the level of violent crime and anti-social behaviour in our communities.”

PROTECTING OUR LOCAL PARKS
